It is imperative to have transparency in government if the will of the constituency is to be done. This year, each council member was afforded the opportunity to provide a message for the newsletter. In addition, the Town began free spotlights for Bay Harbor Islands businesses as well as important Town project presentations. The goal of these changes was to attempt to communicate and engage the public in new ways.

These alterations are just representations of the work that goes into making Bay Harbor Islands what it is. For example, in 2023, the Town laid out and progressed through 123 strategic initiatives. These included park designs for the 92nd Street Park expansion and renovation as well as the design for the upcoming 96th Street Park which will be the first waterfront park on the east island. Both of these parks are slated to be completed in 2024.

In 2023, we rolled out the use of Freebee transportation, an eco-conscious on-demand, transportation service. This program has been so successful, the Town is reviewing expanding its use. We launched a partnership with the Children's Trust to support and expand the recreational and educational options for the Town. Finally, the Town began a large resurfacing project to improve road quality, the process to replace the Town Hall, and evaluated options for the Shepard Broad Causeway.

In 2024, the Town has another 110 strategic initiatives identified for implementation or completion. These include street light upgrades on the west island as well as the expansion and upgrade of speed bumps throughout the Town. The Town has slated public engagement initiatives including additional children's safety supports, new options for civic engagement at the council meetings and a plethora of public events.

On behalf of the Council, Police Department and Town staff, we want to thank you for the opportunity to serve you. May you have a wonderful holiday season and blessed new year.

Volunteers Needed to Serve Bay Harbor Islands

The Town is looking for volunteers to serve on the Parks and Recreation Committee and the Design Review Board.

- Parks and Recreation Committee meets quarterly and provides recommendations and feedback to the Town Council regarding park facilities and recreational programs.
- The Design Review Board meets monthly, except in July and December. Members are required to be a

professional and/or a resident of the Town. Professionals do not have to be residents, but be employed full time in the field of engineering, architecture, land use and zoning law, city planning, construction or other field which substantially relates to the planning and development of real estate.

Members of these Town Board/Committee are required to complete a Statement of Financial Interest on July 1st each year.

Public Comment Rules of Procedure and Decorum - Resolution 2345

On November 8, 2023, the Bay Harbor Islands Town Council approved and adopted Resolution 2345 entitled Public Comment Rules of Procedure and Decorum. Said rules state:

1. For members of the public who would like to address the Town Council, a request form is available from the Town Clerk or Deputy Town Clerk; please fill it in and return it prior to the start of the meeting. Speakers should come to the podium in the front and clearly state their name and address for the record. All request forms must be submitted no later than the conclusion of the "Public Comment" section of the agenda for anyone wishing to speak during "Public Comment" or on any agenda item.
2. All comments must be addressed to the Council as a body and not to individuals. Any person making a racial or slanderous remark or who becomes boisterous while addressing the Town Council, staff, etc. shall be barred from the audience by the presiding officer. No profanity, shouting, heckling, verbal outbursts, or disruptive behavior in support of or opposition to a speaker or his/her remarks is permitted.
3. Please mute or turn off your cell phone or other electronic devices at the start of the meeting. Failure to do so may result in being barred from the meeting. Persons exiting the Chambers shall do so quietly.
4. There is a three (3) minute time limit for each speaker during Public Comment and a two-minute time limit for each speaker during all other agenda items where Public Comment is permitted. Your cooperation is appreciated in observing these time rules. Please contact the Town Manager or appropriate administrative official in advance to arrange a meeting for matters that would require more than three minutes. Speakers should come forward to the podium, give their name and address, and the name and address of the organization they are representing if any.
5. On specific agenda items, speakers must stay on topic i.e., the specific subject matter, the specific contract, ordinance, or resolution in question. Speakers who go off topic may be interrupted and have their comment time concluded.
6. Members of the public may not submit forms for comment on individual agenda items after the close of the Public Comment section of the agenda. Exceptions may be permitted at the discretion of the Presiding Officer.
7. The Presiding Officer has the authority to stop or interrupt any speaker who violates the rules, and to otherwise enforce these rules. If necessary, the Presiding Officer may have someone removed from the meeting. While individuals have a guaranteed right to address the Town Council, that right is tempered by the Town Council's obligation to conduct business and get through the agenda, for the benefit of the Town and its residents.



Highlights of the November 8, 2023, Regular Council Meeting

- Approval of a project agreement from Kimley-Horn and Associates, Inc., in the amount of \$95,765, for the replacement and upgrade of the 100th Street Ejector Station.
- Approval of a resolution awarding a contract for Indian Creek Structural Bridge Repairs to Lead Engineering Contractors, LLC in an amount of \$1,963,014.
- Approval to expend \$80,000, first of five installment payments, to MARK43 for acquisition of a new Records Management System and Computer Aided Dispatch System at a total cost of \$406,608, under a five-year contract.
- Approval of a resolution condemning the terrorist attacks against the State of Israel and expressing support for Israel's people.
- Approval of resolution awarding a contract to V Engineering for seawall replacement at 9600 West Bay Harbor drive, at a cost of \$240,000.
- Approval of a resolution authorizing the Town Manager to execute a Grant Agreement with the State of Florida Department of Environmental Protection for receipt of \$250,000 in grant funding for the Town's Ejector Pump/Manhole Replacement Project.
- Approval of resolution accepting a proposal from Calvin Giordano & Associates to provide engineering services for the Community Center/Parking Garage electrical upgrades and generator installation in the amount of \$71,340.
- Approval of a resolution ratifying and approving a contract with AlliedBean Demolition, Inc. for demolition of Town Hall Facilities (Police Department Building, the Annex Building, and the Public Works Dome) at a cost of \$231,400.54, with an additional contingency of \$50,000 for engineering services.
- Approval of a resolution selecting Alternative 1, 65-foot High-Level Fixed Bridge, for replacement of the Broad Causeway Bridge.
- Approval of a resolution designating the "Thursday" prior to Town elections for Early Voting, in addition to a prior approval for the "Saturday" prior to the election (two days of Early Voting).
- Approval of a resolution adopting Town Council Public Comment Rules of Procedure and Decorum, including completing "Request to Address the Council" forms no later than the "Public Comment" section of the meeting. Provisions will be made for public comments submittal online.
