It's that time of year...we keep one eye on the tropics and the other on making sure children are safe as they return to school. Please remember to put down your phone while driving in our school zone (or anywhere else for that matter). Children are always excited to see their friends the first few weeks of school, and they may, despite our best efforts, not always adhere to road safety measures. Further, the repairs on the Indian Creek Bridge (the bridge into Surfside) will not be complete when the school year starts, likely adding to the normal school traffic. Please plan your trips accordingly, adding extra time. To minimize the traffic impact when the school year begins, we have coordinated with our neighboring police departments to alleviate back-ups east of the bridge.

As we enter the new school year, we also begin a new chapter in child activities in Bay Harbor Islands. In an effort to significantly improve our after-school and day camp offerings, the Town has engaged the YMCA to administer a whole new series of programs for our children. The expanded menu of options allows for better services and far superior use of Town funds, while protecting (and most likely improving) services offered to seniors. It is the intent of the Town Council to continuously provide the highest level of services to residents of all ages.

With regard to the tropics, it is no secret the experts have predicted a much busier than usual hurricane season. Please plan accordingly, and do not wait until the last minute to make basic storm preparations. Simple actions such as having a method to protect crucial documents, keeping extra prescription medication available, checking your storm shutters and purchasing basic supplies including water, batteries and canned food should be taken at the start of every storm season, rather than waiting until we are "in the cone." In the event of a storm, heed warnings, and do not try to ride it out if an evacuation is ordered. The Town will do everything possible to protect its citizens, but you must be responsible for your own well-being and that of your family.

Finally, our community mourns the loss of two leaders. Stanley Tate, Bay Harbors Islands' second mayor and one of the instrumental early members of our Town, passed away in July. While very few of our current residents lived in Bay Harbor during Mr. Tate's tenure, his influence remains. Further, if you or your child participated in the Florida Pre-Paid College Program, thank Mr. Tate. It was his creation. On the same day as Mr. Tate's passing, the City of Aventura lost Commissioner Michael Stern. It is due to Commissioner Stern's efforts that Bay Harbor Islands and many other local communities have routinely declared March as Colorectal Cancer Awareness Month. If you are over the age of 45, please get screened for this very treatable disease (if caught early). Our condolences go out to the Tate and Stern families.

Learn About the Broad Causeway Pass Plan

- The Pass Plan is a flat-rate convenience toll-pass subscription program for use with SunPass transponders, only. **NON-SUNPASS TRANSPONDERS AND PLATES ARE INELIGIBLE FOR EXEMPTION.**
- The current cost of an Annual Pass Plan is \$350 and the cost for 6-months is \$225.
- Your SunPass account must be in you or your spouse's name and be properly funded, without a history of toll violations.
- Your vehicle must have a Florida plate and a current, valid Florida vehicle registration in your name (or in the name of your spouse) and the plate must be registered to the same SunPass account as your transponder.
- You must have a current, valid Florida Driver License.
- Your SunPass transponder must be properly mounted in/on your vehicle at all times so that it is read consistently when using the Shepard Broad Causeway toll.
- Your SunPass account must reflect a positive balance without interruption, for the length of your Pass Plan subscription.
- If the exempt transponder is not read by the receiver in the electronic toll collection lane for any reason, you are 100% responsible for that toll charge and for determining the cause. License plates are not associated with your Pass Plan and license plate charges are not covered by the Pass Plan. **NO REFUNDS WILL BE CONSIDERED OR GIVEN** should you be charged via your license plate.
- The information provided on your application is sent to SunPass for verification and your SunPass account



- activity is reviewed for the past 90-days.
- Any of the following is reason for rejection:
 - ✘ Information on the application that does not match your SunPass account.
 - ✘ Not having your license plate on your SunPass account or a mismatch in what you provided.
 - ✘ Having an out of state driver license or vehicle registration.
 - ✘ A negative balance at any time in the last 90-days.
 - ✘ A low balance (less than \$25) and not being enrolled in auto-replenishment.
 - ✘ Outstanding toll charges of any kind.
 - ✘ Toll-charges in collections.
 - ✘ Previously defaulting on a toll bill.
