ANNUAL TOWN COUNCIL ELECTION - UPDATE

Two seats up for vote on April 7th

The Town of Bay Harbor Islands will hold its annual municipal election Tuesday, April 7th, to fill two seats on the Town Council. As of the writing of this Newsletter, no resident or incumbent has officially announced their candidacy.

All residents who are registered voters are urged to come to Town Hall on Election Day between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. to cast votes to fill the open seats. Under state law, the books close to new registrations 29 days prior to the election (March 9th). If you haven't registered to vote, changed your address or have any questions about your registration, please contact the Miami-Dade County Elections Department at 305-499-8683. The Town's two precincts are combined in one location for our municipal election. The polling place is located in the Council Chambers on the second floor of Town Hall at 9665 Bay Harbor Terrace. Remember to bring your voter's card and official photo identification with your name, address and signature (such as a driver's license).

If you wish to become a candidate for a Town Council seat, file with the Town Clerk during regular business hours at Town Hall after 9 a.m. on Thursday, February 27th and before 5 p.m. on Friday, March 6th. To qualify you must be a registered voter and have been a Bay Harbor resident for at least 12 months.

Beginning Friday, February 14, FLOW will be at the Morris N. Broad Community Center every second Friday of the month from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m.

FLOW will be offering the following services:

- Original Class E (includes Learner's license and Out of State Reciprocity \$48)
- Renewals (\$48 for Class E License - plus \$7 per endorsement)
- Replacement license or identification cards services including address/name changes (\$25)
- ID cards (\$25)
- Original/Renewal Commercial Driver License (\$75 plus \$7 per endorsement)
- Vehicle Registration Renewals (fees vary)
- Disabled Parking Placard Issuance and Renewals (Permanent - free/Temporary - \$15)
- Special designations (Veterans, Deaf/Hard of Hearing, Developmentally Disabled or FWC)

Note that written tests or skills examinations are not conducted through FLOW programs.



New laws prohibiting texting while driving were explained for adults. Citations with fees and points are given for texting and driving. Also, school zones and construction areas are "hands free only" areas, meaning you can be cited if you are seen holding your cell phone in your hand.

This census provides the basis for reapportioning Congressional seats and distributing billions of dollars in federal funding to support services and infrastructure in communities across the country. Bay Harbor Islands encourages every resident to participate in the census to ensure proper representation in Congress and a fair share of federal funds for schools, transportation, public works and other vital programs. Taking the census is safe and easy. Your data is confidential and protected by federal law. Your answers can only be used to produce statistics. By law, your information cannot be shared with immigration enforcement agencies, law enforcement agencies, or be used to determine your eligibility for government benefits.



Council Action at the Jan. 7 Public Hearing

- **Approval** of an ordinance on **second** reading approving a development agreement between N/R Wharton Kane Concourse Property Owner, LLC and the Town. The agreement will authorize the development located at 1177 Kane Concourse of a mixed used project consisting of 90 residential units, 98,800 square feet of office space and approximately 15,5000 square feet of commercial space.
